

## Instructions | "Am I Rural?" Tool Instructions

## The "Am I Rural" Look Up tool is located at: <a href="https://www.ruralhealthinfo.org/am-i-rural">https://www.ruralhealthinfo.org/am-i-rural</a>

The website includes a video that provides instruction on how to use the tool ("Using RHIhub's Am I Rural? Tool"). Follow the instructions to obtain the "Am I Rural? – Report" required to determine whether the address is considered rural.

## **Projects Approved in 2013:**

- 1) In the report, locate "Common Rural Definitions."
- 2) Locate "Urbanized Areas / Urban Clusters." Addresses identified as "Not located in an Urbanized Area area or Urban Cluster" or "Urban Cluster" are considered Rural. Only addresses identified as "Urbanized Areas" are considered Urban.

## Projects Approved in 2014, 2015, and 2016:

- 1) In the report, locate "Common Rural Definitions."
- 2) Locate "RUCA (Rural Urban Commuting Areas) Census Tracts." Addresses located in a Census tract (or ZIP code only if Census tract is unavailable) with a Rural Urban Commuting Area (RUCA) code of "micropolitan, small town, or rural" (RUCA primary codes 4-10) are considered rural.
